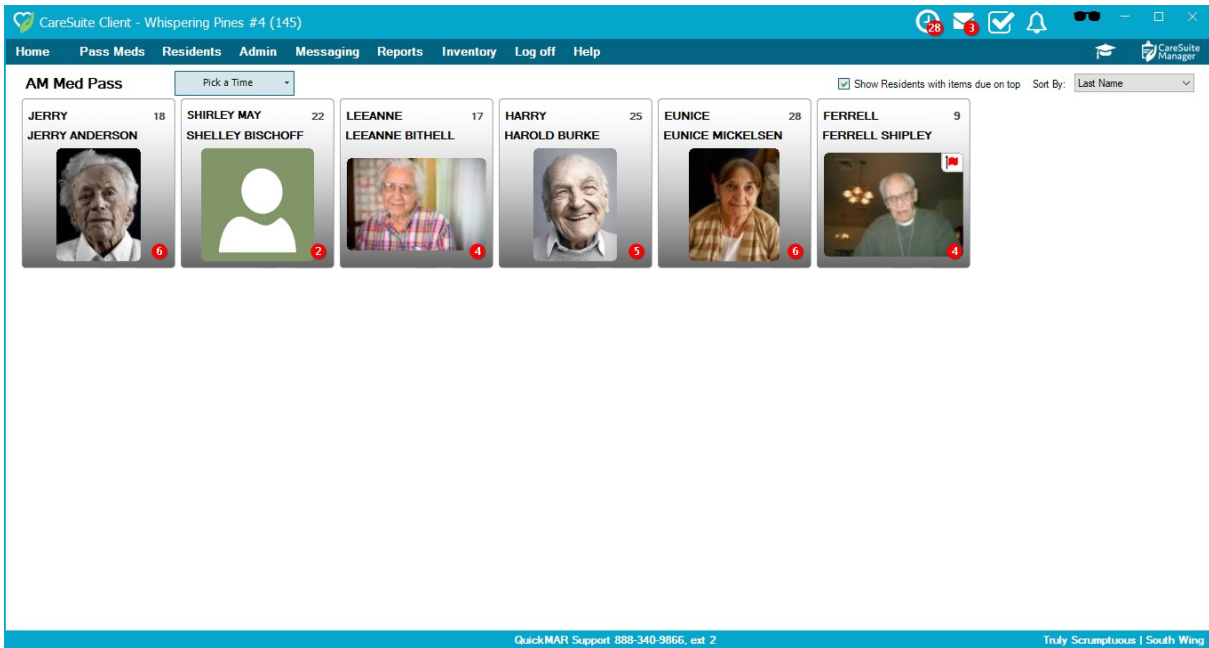

Question 8.

After you have selected the right time and the right resident and verified the medication information, what do you do next? Put the following med pass steps in the correct order.

#	Choice	Correct order
1	Hide your screen for privacy by clicking on the sunglasses icon in the top, right-hand side of your screen.	
2	Scan/select the medications, treatments and vitals you plan to administer.	
3	Administer the medications, treatments and vitals.	
4	Click "Next" in the bottom, right-hand corner of the screen.	
5	Enter any vital sign results, exceptions and/or notes for the pass.	
6	Select "Record All," in the bottom, right-hand side of the screen.	
7	Unhide your screen by clicking anywhere in the CareSuite Client privacy box.	

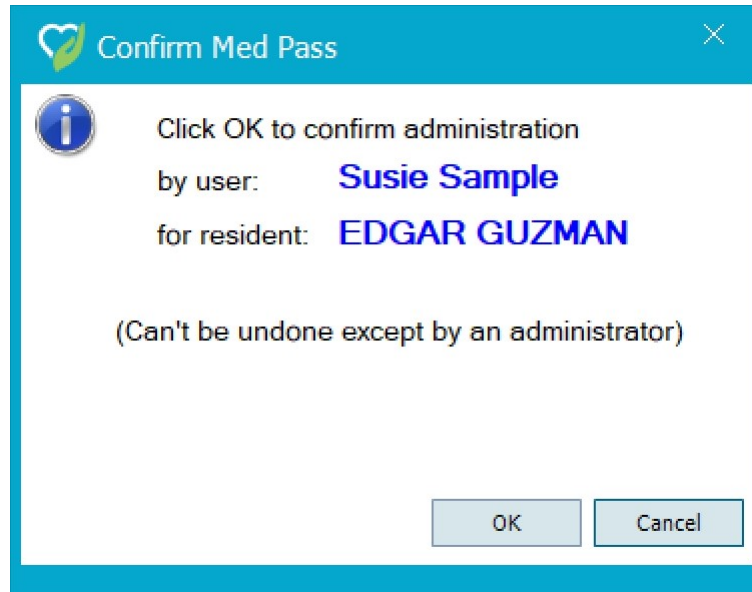
Question 9.
